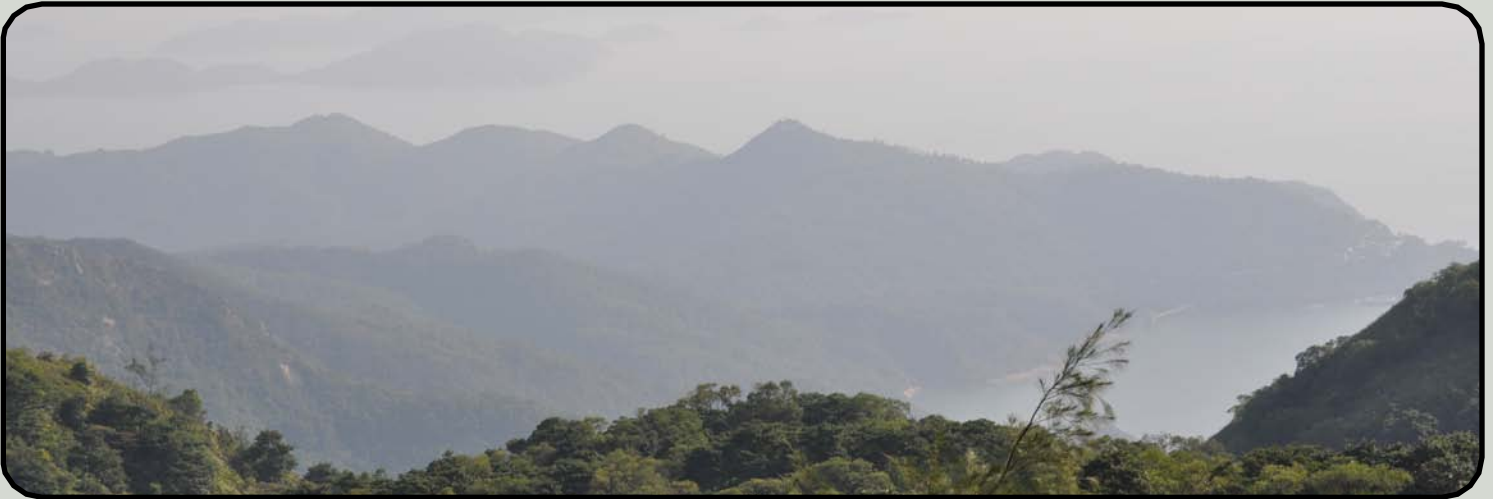

PERU

HUAMACHUCO & TRUJILLO

Update from Scott Hudspeth

After arriving in Lima, we visited and conducted a service at the **Rebano De Jesus** orphanage in Lima, an orphanage supported by TEN. We also visited the other orphanage supported by TEN in Lima, **Juan Pablo**, with our contact and coordinator **Victor Castilla**.

In Trujillo, we had the privilege to work with Pastor **Tito Seville**. What an awesome man of God he is! Here we had the opportunity to serve the people of Trujillo, and later in Huamachuco through medical clinics. In Trujillo, we spent 3 days in the barrio (slum) of Alto Trujillo conducting a medical clinic where we were also able to minister to the spiritual needs of the people. This was done by conducting a service each night at the local church. The people live in extreme poverty-no running water, no sewage. A basic house consists of approximately a 10 x 10 foot straw shelter, with dirt floors. We were so blessed by the people. While in Trujillo we saw 20 people commit to become followers of Christ.

We then made the six hour drive through the Andes to Huamachuco. Pastor Tito had planted and started a church there. We spent three days at the church serving through medical clinics. Through sharing the Gospel, we were able to see the LORD work in the hearts of 85 new believers.

Through the use of medical clinics in both locations, we were able to serve the medical needs of approximately 450 people. I have no doubt Pastor Tito and the other pastors will continue to water the seeds that were planted.

I have been on several mission trips and have found the most encouraging thing to me is being able to serve alongside the native pastors. I thank the LORD for a ministry like TEN and ask for your prayers for this wonderful ministry.

TRUJILLO

Update from Bruce Azlin

Recently I had the opportunity to visit **Hogar de Esperanza**, an orphanage supported by TEN. Hogar de Esperanza is an orphanage located in Trujillo, Peru.

While at Hogar de Esperanza, I met Oriana, an 8 year old girl who was found on the streets. She was placed in the orphanage after it was determined that it was unsafe to return her to her family. Although we did not share a common language, it did not hinder us from exchanging many smiles.

I will never forget the day she grabbed my hand and got me to see-saw with her. For that short time, the love of our Savior enabled me to bring a smile to her face, despite all the heartaches she had experienced in her short life. This is what we, as Christians, are meant to do.

TOYS OF JOY

The Toys of Joy Team just returned from Lima and Trujillo, where we visited 14 ministry sites in 6 days. We delivered over 2000 toys, 100 pairs of shoes, and countless cups of hot chocolate and slices of fruitcake. Most importantly, we were able to share the Gospel in each of these locations.

Update from Michael A. Maldanis

In November I led my second trip for TEN to East Asia. I have been leading teams here for the last ten years and have recognized such an affinity in my heart for the Asian people and culture. One of the striking differences (among many) in the Asian culture and ours is the concept of God. If you asked anyone on the street here in the U.S. who God was, chances are they would have a good definition, even if they were not a believer in Him. Ask the same question in Asia and you could have literally thousands of answers.

As my dear Chinese friend Jane puts it, "We have been told all our lives about the gods, but no one has ever said...that God...THAT is the MOST HIGH GOD!"

Partnering with a local ministry to college and young professionals, we've been able to engage with the lost and the found in Asia. We've been able to encourage their knowledge of the Most High God and educate those who have not yet heard. Each trip I have taken I have come away knowing at least one person who I just KNEW I was there to meet. This trip was no different. His name is Martin. Martin's desire is to lead, train, and develop people to be better than they have ever been before so

that they can be amazing professionals. Martin needs to know Jesus so that he can indeed be that very influencer, but for Jesus' sake!

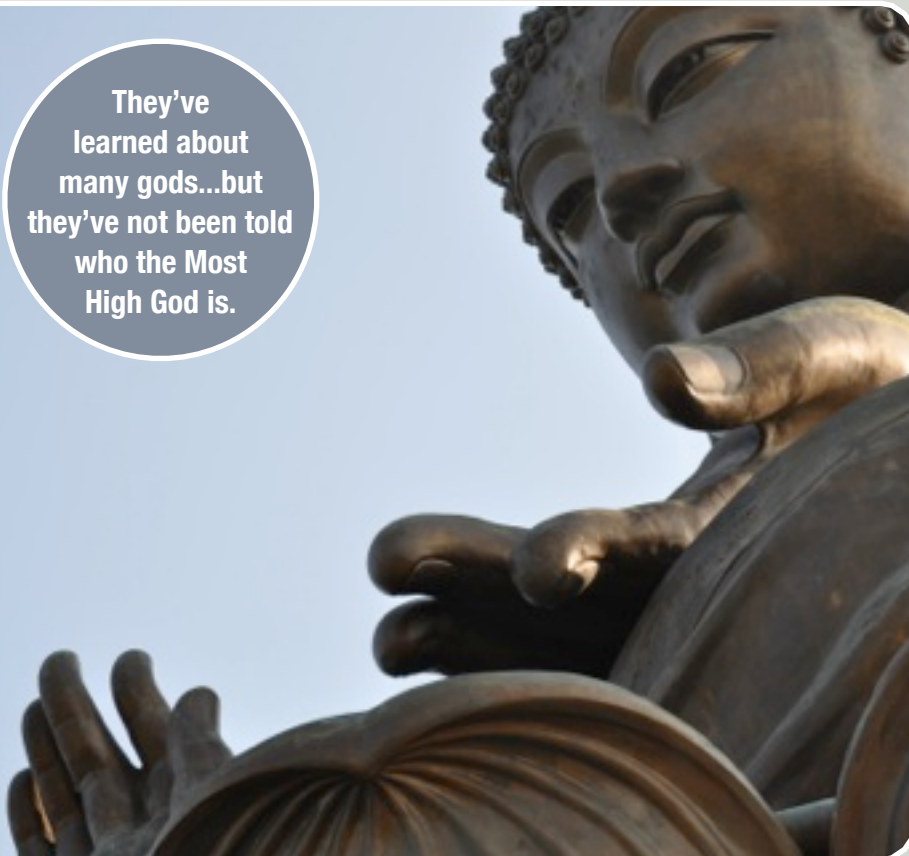
NEPAL

Update from Richard Hardy

March of this year had me traveling with my friend Ben and spending 10 days in Nepal. We were there to view land that was donated to TEN by a local health care worker, **Hemu Thomas**. Hemu and I had been in contact for several years, and he has never asked for anything other than our prayers. It doesn't take long to recognize that Hemu has a passion for the street children of Nepal and deeply wants to see them have an opportunity for a safe environment and future. This burden even moves him to provide some of these children with rooms at local hostels for the night, just so they can sleep indoors.

Hemu has been working on his own and saving up money; he desires so strongly for a structure to be built for these children. In 2012 a team from TEN will arrive to pray and pursue the best route for this land. Two options have been presented: The first is to sell the land and purchase another larger plot that will accommodate more children. The second option is to pursue building on the current location.

They've learned about many gods...but they've not been told who the Most High God is.

KENYA

In our second project together, TEN was able to provide a one-time support gift for **COMIDO** Children's Centre in Kenya.

In 2010, TEN provided the other half of the cost to drill an onsite water well that would provide clean water for the children.

Just a few days ago, we were able to provide classrooms for the 46 children who are cared for here by Pastor **Bonface Simani** and his wife **Nancy**.



MEXICO

Beginning in April of 2009, TEN has partnered with **Hector & Silvia Martinez** in their ministry to the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico.

Hector is a full-time missionary with AWANA and is responsible for a five state region in Mexico.

Since July alone, Hector has preached 15 sermons, led 46 new believers to Jesus, and trained 127 AWANA leaders.
